On the Trail of the Pilgrims

400th Anniversary of America's Founding

7 DAYS • 12 MEALS Follow the trail of the Pilgrims and celebrate the 400th Anniversary of America's founding. See where they landed at Provincetown before settling at Plimoth Plantation. See the full-scale replica *Mayflower II* and enjoy a traditional Thanksgiving dinner.

DAY 1 Arrive in Massachusetts: Arrive Boston today to begin your journey in search of the Pilgrims. Meet your Tour Manager and fellow travelers at a welcome dinner.

Meal: D

DAY 2 The Pilgrims, Longfellow and Myles Standish: Begin in Boston with a special presentation about the Pilgrims that arrived on the *Mayflower* as well as the Wampanoan people at the New England Historic Genealogical Society. A narrated tour of Boston includes King's Chapel Burying Ground where the grave of Mary Chilton, the first European woman to arrive here is located. In Duxbury, visit the home of Pilgrims John and Priscilla Alden, immortalized in Longfellow's poem *The Courtship of Miles Standish*. Now a museum, the home saw the Aldens become prosperous farmers and raise 10 children. A stop is made at the grave site of Myles Standish before coming to the hotel. **Meals: B, D**

DAY 3 Touring in Plymouth Town: Your local guide conducts a sightseeing tour of the town of Plymouth today. See where Mobbamock, a Wampanoag priest who stayed with the colonists during the year had his home. Also see where the Pilgrims first began arranging their housing sites after disembarking the *Mayflower* in 1620. The famed first Thanksgiving was held nearby in 1621. Visit the National Monument to the Forefathers and tour the Pilgrim Hall Museum, the nation's oldest continuously operating public museum with an unmatched collection of Pilgrim possessions. **Meals: B, D**

DAY 4 Plimoth Plantation, *Mayflower II* and Clark's Island: Start the day at Plimoth Plantation. This living history museum re-creates the lives, experiences and concerns of Pilgrim life from the year 1627. Mingle with costumed interpreters and see live demonstrations of blacksmithing, farming and cooking along with the relationship to the Wampanoag people in the village. At

the waterfront, see the famed Plymouth Rock along with a detailed replica of the colonists vessel the *Mayflower II*. Go aboard, meet the Pilgrims and see the sailing conditions from 1620. A cruise in Plymouth Bay show you Clark’s Island where the Pilgrims celebrated their first Sabbath in the New World. Back in Plimoth Plantation, a special Tribal Feast Dinner awaits. **Meals: B, D**

DAY 5 Provincetown, Cape Cod and Thanksgiving: Journey to Provincetown where the Pilgrim’s first set foot and see the plaques commemorating the landing and the signing of the *Mayflower Compact*, the first governing document of the Plymouth Colony. The “First Encounter” marker commemorates Myles Standish’s meeting with the Wampanoags on December 8, 1620. While not a pleasant meeting, it did lead the Pilgrims to continue on to Plymouth where they settled. Tonight enjoy a traditional Thanksgiving dinner followed by a painting session of Delft tiles at the Plantation. **Meals: B, D**

DAY 6 Martha’s Vineyard: For over ten thousand years the Wampanoag people have inhabited the island of Noepe, now called Martha’s Vineyard. Take the ferry to this resort island. Learn the history of the Wampanoag at the Aquinnah Cultural Center where exhibits on culture, whaling and artwork are on display. Visit the village of Edgartown with its gingerbread cottages and see the cliffs at Gays Head. **Meals: B, D**

DAY 7 Travel Home: Say goodbye to the east coast with a group transfer to the Boston’s Logan Airport for flights out after 1:00 p.m. **Meal: B**

Cherry Blossom Time in Our Nation's Capital

featuring Washington, DC and Williamsburg

7 DAYS • 9 MEALS Join the annual celebration of the gift of beautiful cherry trees from the people of Japan to the people of the United States. Then tour Washington, DC, Arlington National Cemetery and Colonial Williamsburg.

DAY 1 Arrive in Washington, DC: Your tour begins with an included hotel transfer from Washington Reagan National Airport. A welcome dinner at 6:00 p.m. is hosted by your Tour Manager. **Meal: D**

DAY 2 National Cherry Blossom Parade and Mount Vernon: Enjoy the beauty and aroma of blossoming cherry trees as you view the National Cherry Blossom Parade from reserved seats. Marching down Constitution Avenue, the parade showcases floats, helium balloons, international performance groups and some of the country's finest marching bands. No tour of colonial America is complete without a stop at Mount Vernon, the expansive estate of George and Martha Washington. Visit the Ford Orientation Center and the Donald W. Reynolds Museum where you will have the chance to experience Washington's life through movies and exhibitions. Explore his mansion filled with 18th century treasures and stroll the gardens of this 45-acre estate,


taking in the views of the Potomac River from the mansion's piazza. **Meals: B**

DAY 3 Arlington National Cemetery and Washington, DC Touring: Sightseeing in your nation's capital includes Arlington National Cemetery and the John F. Kennedy Memorial. See the Changing of the Guard at the Tomb of the Unknown Soldier. In the mall area see the FDR, Vietnam and Lincoln Memorials along with the National WWII Memorial. After dinner an Illumination tour of Washington, DC's mall area highlights the nation's monuments and memorials bathed in light. **Meals: B, D**

DAY 4 Ford's Theatre, Petersen House and Smithsonian's Museum of American History: Begin the day at Ford's Theatre where on April 14, 1865 President Abraham Lincoln was assassinated by John Wilkes Booth. See the one act play One Destiny which recounts the evening's events before visiting Petersen

House, the boarding house where Lincoln died. Later, enjoy time to visit the Smithsonian Institution. The world's largest museum complex and research organization, it is composed of 16 museums in Washington, DC. The American History Museum's collection contains more than three million historical objects including the famed Star-Spangled Banner as well as documents which explore the evolution of the American identity. **Meal: B**

DAY 5 Jamestown Settlement and American Revolution Museum at Yorktown: Today features a journey of historic proportions. At Jamestown Settlement, the site of America's first permanent English colony, explore life at the dawn of the 17th century inside the palisade of a re-created colonial fort. Also discover the world of Pocahontas in the Powhatan Indian Village. At the American Revolution Museum at Yorktown learn about the Revolution that led to the establishment of a new nation almost two centuries later. **Meal: B**

DAY 6 Colonial Williamsburg: At Colonial Williamsburg stroll streets dating back to the 1700s. Converse with residents playing the roles of their ancestors of more than 200 years ago. Tonight, enjoy a traditional Colonial tavern dinner in Colonial Williamsburg. **Meals: B, D**

DAY 7 Washington, DC and Home: Travel to Washington, DC, on a group transfer to Washington Reagan National Airport for flights out after 2:00 p.m. **Meal: B**



featuring the Museum of the Bible, Creation Museum and Ark Encounter

7 DAYS • 10 MEALS Join a journey on the “Road of Faith.” Be amazed at the full-size replica of Noah’s Ark, discover the bible’s history at the Museum of the Bible and walk through years of biblical history at the Creation Museum.

DAY 1 *Arrive in Washington, DC:* Your tour begins with an included hotel transfer from Washington Reagan National Airport. A welcome dinner at 6:00 p.m. is hosted by your Tour Manager. **Meal: D**

DAY 2 *Washington, DC National Mall Touring and Museum of the Bible:* Today a local guide conducts a narrated tour of our Nation’s Capital. While touring through the National Mall area see the many monuments and memorials dedicated to past presidents and the nation’s wars including the National World War II Memorial. At the Museum of the Bible, discover the Bible’s history from hand-written scrolls, through rare artifacts spanning 3,500 years of history. Walk through the stories of the Hebrew Bible, immerse yourself in first-century Nazareth and listen to the story of how followers of Jesus grew into a thriving community. After dinner, an Illumination tour of Washington, DC includes views of the memorials and monuments bathed in light. **Meals: B, D**

DAY 3 *Arlington National Cemetery, Washington National Cathedral and Law Enforcement Museum:* Start today at Arlington National Cemetery to see the gravesites of John and Robert Kennedy as well as the eternal flame that burns in dedication to the memory of JFK. Appreciate the military precision of the Changing of the Guard Ceremony at the Tomb of the Unknown Soldier. At the Washington National Cathedral, a “Spiritual Home for the Nation,” see the beautiful architecture and grounds. Next, tour the new National Law Enforcement Museum. Hear, experience and feel what it’s like to walk in the shoes of law enforcement officials in this newly-opened museum. **Meal: B**

DAY 4 *Cambridge’s “Hopalong Cassidy”:* In the Ohio town of Cambridge, the six-foot bronze statue of William Boyd, better known as “Hopalong Cassidy” greets you. See the exhibits dedicated to this beloved cowboy hero. **Meals: B, D**

DAY 5 The Creation Museum: Continue to the Cincinnati area for a visit to the Creation Museum. Here, the history of the Bible vividly comes to life at this state-of-the-art museum. You'll walk through biblical history, see the Garden of Eden and experience Noah's flood through exciting exhibits which bring the pages of the Bible to life through the retelling of its stories. **Meal: B**

DAY 6 Noah's Ark Encounter: Today is spent at the impressive Ark Encounter. This massive, full-size, all wood replica of Noah's Ark presents a number of historic events centered on this one-of-a-kind historically themed attraction. Spanning 510 feet long, 85 feet wide and 51 feet high, it is designed to be family oriented, historically authentic and is the largest timber frame structure in the country. Tonight, dinner is at the first authentic Hofbrauhaus in America. Modeled after its 400 year-old cousin in Munich it features traditionally decorated rooms and excellent German fare. It's Wunderbar! **Meals: B, D**

DAY 7 Travel Home: Your journey ends with a group transfer to the Cincinnati Airport for flights out after 11:00 a.m. **Meal: B**

Refund and Cancellation Policy

All payments for land, air and train arrangements (ticketed by Mayflower Cruises & Tours) will be refunded when cancellations are more than 90 days prior to departure less the deposit amount, which is non-refundable, unless otherwise noted below. If you purchase the optional Travelers Protection Plan (TPP), you will be refunded all payments, including the deposit amount, less the TPP premium amount.

This non-refundable fee waives all cancellation fees and penalties, provided we are notified of the cancellation one day before your tour departs. While on tour, if a passenger must leave early due to a personal illness, illness or death of a member of the immediate family, the purchase of the Travelers Protection Plan (TPP) guarantees full refund for any unused services (including purchased optional excursions) after the departure of the tour. 

